SAILING NEWS from Anne, Rear Commodore Sailing



We have had some very successful and well attended sailing events over the summer, with the local Pottering being particularly popular. The weather has been very changeable and gusty this season, with Storm Floris et al, preventing us

enjoying both some of our time-tabled dinghy races and our longer distance Potters, masterminded with precision again this year by Nick G.

The Junior Sailing Week in July organised and run by Peter L. proved very popular this summer with a record number of participants. There are still 2 months of our season to run, comprising a variety of about 28 sailing events, all of which need volunteer support to allow them to go ahead. Just a couple of clicks away on the website is the Events and Duty rota indicating spaces remaining for the opportunity to get some practice.

There are also 7 sessions of the Beginners and Improvers dinghy sail Training throughout September and October, details in your Programme of Events booklet and on the website.

The Cruisers had to adapt their programme this season as well: the unpredictable weather caused cancellation of Kevin Wheeler's July rally to Poole. Undaunted, Kevin shortly afterwards led an impromptu midweek gathering of 5 club boats to Bembridge for a very enjoyable supper at Brading Haven Yacht Club before an early morning departure in blustery conditions to catch the tide out of Bembridge and, for some, a hard beat with wind against tide back up the Solent. The weather was much kinder for Robin and Roxanne Ford's August bank holiday weekend rally to Bucklers Hard with the traditional barbeque. BOOKING CLUB BOATS ONLINE

The Club is introducing an online booking system for all Club Boats. This system will enable members to book Club Boats without having to go to the Clubhouse.

The online booking system will operate from **Monday 6**th **October 2025**. The current diary-based system will cease to operate from that day. Also, from that day all payments for the hire of Club Boats will be by direct bank transfer. No cash payments will be accepted. Details of the Club's bank account for bank transfers are shown in the online booking system.

There will be an initial registration process to go though in order to be signed up for the online booking system. You will be able to **register** from **Monday 15**th **September** but please continue to use the Clubhouse diary-based booking service until 6th October.

Registration will be done via the 'On the Water' section of the Club website (<u>www.hcsc.org.uk</u>). The registration link on the website will be live from 15th September.

Notes for guidance on registering for the online booking system will be sent out shortly to all members via email.

We hope you will find the online booking system more convenient, particularly for members who are not local to the Clubhouse.


